# Royal Air Force Ornithological Society Wetland Bird Survey (WeBS)

## Collation of Data on Three Diver Species for WeBS in Northwest and North Scotland

## 2009 to 2013

#### Introduction:

The Royal Air Force Ornithological Society (RAFOS) has continued to undertake yearly monitoring, via 'Winter Duck' surveys, of non-breeding water-birds in support of national surveys in the far north of Scotland during the winter months of January-February. This account depicts the diver species data from 2009 to 2013 inclusive. RAFOS has built a close working relationship with The British Trust for Ornithology WeBS office such that this relationship has enabled the society to function in the field by targeting specific requirements of the BTO to ensure that we supply meaningful and most importantly on a survey of this type, continuous data.

As well as WeBS, during the period of this account the RAFOS team supplied data via the BTO BirdTrack scheme towards the coordinated efforts of The Bird Atlas (The Breeding and Winter Birds of Britain and Ireland 2007-2011) [1]. Some records from this data will be included where considered of interest or benefit to the reader. This paper will present data of scientific interest on the WeBS species that in future years can help to build up a picture of overwintering waterbirds to our northernmost shores from Arctic waters including, it is thought, birds overwintering in GB waters from Scandinavia, as well as migratory species that use our island for winter feeding, roosting and shelter.

All WeBS data and BirdTrack data remain with the BTO as the national co-ordinating body with their partners of both surveys; Calbrade N,A. et al (2010). We thank them for permission in reproducing data here from the electronic WeBS (e-WeBs) database.

## Survey background

The WeBS counts monitor non-breeding waterbirds across the UK at approximately 2000 wetland sites via Monthly Core Counts. The UK is of outstanding international importance for waterbirds as it lies on some of the major flyways for arctic breeding species. Large numbers are atttracted to our coasts, rivers and inland wetland sites especially during winter, with a generally milder climate compared to continental Europe and extensive areas of wetland notably estuaries. The UK thus has both moral and legal obligations to conserve these waterbirds and the wetlands upon which they depend. Calbrade N.A. et al (2010). [2].

RAFOS conduct Single Visit Core Count surveys in lieu of the monthly counts due to the remoteness of the area and the restricted time available for surveys. The BTO recognise that this remoteness coupled with a low population density has lead to very little knowledge of the wetland bird population wintering in the area apart from data from a few co-ordinated counts by BTO/WWT volunteers. RAFOS surveys cover open stretches of sea, rugged shorelines, sea lochs and some slightly inland large, medium and small lochs down to very small lochans.

## Logistics and sponsors.

The logistics and conducting of the surveys generally follow the pattern described in the Winter Duck 2005 – 2008 report but with small changes to the accommodation locations and to the detailed itineraries of each team.

The survey counting commences usually on a Sunday and ends the following Friday but the preparation and recovery period of the expedition takes in the region of a week to ten days from hire vehicle collection to vehicle return to their home RAF bases. Financial support over this five year period has in some years been through sponsorship from both Air BP International and Aircraft Services International Group (ASIG). The key inputs of these two organisations are instrumental in ensuring that we can mount our field study from a financially sound footing. The other 'prime' sponsors are the Society members, by way of their yearly subscriptions to support the Society's fieldwork. This financial backing is recognised in this report. The remainder of the survey finances are made-up from the participants contributions.

The team was split into three sub-teams to cover the extensive survey area with accommodation being widely spread in order to minimise travel logistics and fuel costs.

The three teams utilised four base locations which were a mix of military and civilian self-catering accommodation as follows:

- Team 1 Joint Service Mountain Training Centre, Dundonnell (Base HQ)
- Team 2 Knockan Crag Cottage, Elphin (2009-2012) and Glencoul Cottage, Unapool (2013)
- Team 3 Freswick, Tofts House & Defence Estates (now structured as The Defence Infrastructure Organisation (DIO) at Cape Wrath Range Hut, Faraid Head, near Durness.

After four days surveying in their assigned areas, on day five Team 2 moved south to cover part of the southern survey area of Loch Carron, Strathcarron to Applecross and along the coast to Calliekille whilst team 1 covered Upper Loch Torridon, Annat and Inveralligin to Lower Diabaig. Team 3 continued surveying from John O' Groats to Durness, including Lochs Heilen and Mey, and in some years extending out to Cape Wrath if no range activities were planned and if deer culling or weather conditions permitted.

**e-WeBS.** Webs data is now available on the BTO web site via e-WeBS not only for contributors, but researchers and personnel interested in checking data on bird totals; their fluctuations or site dependency.

**Birdtrack 2009-2013 and Atlas 2007-2011 records**. Records of those passerines and other species outwith WeBS were recorded at the 10Km Grid Square as Roving Records during the Atlas recording years or thereafter as Birdtrack 10km records.

**Records of Importance.** In line with 'Water-birds in the UK' Calbrade, N.A. et al (2010), records are tabulated into five categories:

- Sites of international importance in the UK.
- Sites of national importance in Great Britain.
- Sites of all importance in Northern Ireland.
- Sites no-longer meeting table qualifying levels in WeBS year (Date of Report).
- Sites below table qualifying levels but exceeding threshold levels in WeBS Year [Date of Report] {GB and NI}.

In line with the WeBS Report each species is annotated a threshold value to allow the reader to gauge the importance of each Site/Sector referenced in this paper.

**GB Mean threshold values**: A wetland in Britain is considered nationally important if it regularly holds 1% or more of the estimated British numbers of one species or subspecies of waterbird. The 1% threshold levels are quoted for each of the diver species tables.

**Qualifying Level:** The minimum number of a species present at a site to allow for inclusion of the record in the BTO WeBS annual journal.

#### **Tables of Observations**

## **Red-throated Diver**

Gavia stelata.

**GB Threshold 170** 

None of the RAFOS WD site survey counts come close to meeting either the UK threshold or the qualifying level [i.e. the minimum count reflected in the WeBSs report tables]. An example being – the qualifying level of 50 birds was used in the 2009 WeBS Report. Widespread at coastal locations throughout the UK during the winter, with an estimated population of 17,000 in British waters (O'Brien et al. 2008).

All counts of this species are shown to allow the reader to make comparisons of birds seen on Winter Duck against those of other diver species and those sites in southern UK that hold divers throughout the winter in offshore waters. This species of diver was not found, on the survey, in any great numbers. It is quite a highlight when this species is located, as the statistics appear to support the view that birds must over-winter further south in the UK.

### Gavia arctica

#### GB Threshold = 7

Black-throated divers appear in the main, to use those same favoured sites as found on previous Winter Duck years. The tendency is to see them in small parties, and usually these groups are often located as the birds go to roost at dusk; these birds favouring to fish together as pre-roost groups. The assembled groups appear to have very coordinated behaviour patterns as fishing parties, undertaking collective and coordinated diving and submerged hunting; twisting and turning to gather fish, shellfish and other quarry. During the main part of the day birds appear to favour their own company or at most as a pair, before seemingly grouping together later in the day pre-dusk and usually from 15:00-17:00. The key sites seem to be: Loch Gruinard, Gruinard Bay, Callakille, an open sea stretch north of Applecross, and the top northeasternmost part of Loch Ewe around the bay from Aultbea - Mellon Charles, where an impressive 24 were located at Loch Ewe - Aultbea - Gob A Gheodha on 24 Feb 2010. This behaviour again showed the grouping tendency. The day was a non-survey free bird watching day but the record was submitted because of its importance. This record was also submitted as an Atlas 2007-11 Roving Record.

The survey totals in 2010, were very low and early in the week it was identified between the teams that although there were reasonable totals of ducks, swans and geese at water bodies, very few divers, in particular Great-Northern Divers, were being seen.

2011 was an unusual year in both the weather and in bird numbers counted, in particular for the diver species. Extreme winds produced choppy waters which hindered observations and greatly affected the numbers of birds seen. Reasons for the low numbers as considered by the teams included: poor visibility particularly with telescope use, bird movements to areas of less harsh conditions and limited observation time on site due to the weather. In an attempt to answer these questions Friday 5<sup>th</sup> Feb 2011 was a free day for general observations so a concerted effort was made to count divers in the Loch Gairloch – Loch Ewe area ending up near Mellon Charles. The Loch itself was much quieter, almost mill-pond like in comparison to the rest of the week. The points of poor visibility and observer's time on site were addressed. Here are the coordinated Atlas 2011 – Roving Records for Black-throated Diver that we submitted on that day amassing a grand total of 47 birds

**Comparison with the earlier survey day results:** The WeBS sector in question, where the 34 birds were located is Loch Ewe – Aultbea – Gob A Gheodha to Mellon Charles, specifically near to the soap studio at Mellon Charles. Good weather played its part in totals due to the increased visibility of the large sea loch areas. Posing the thought; were the 34 birds there 5 days previously? Doubtful, but sometime during the following days a collective movement of birds to shelter appears to have occurred.

## **Great Northern Diver**

Gavia immer

GB Threshold = 25

This was the most numerous of the diver species recorded by RAFOS across these Winter Duck surveys. Most sightings were of solitary birds, which sometimes were spread widely on the larger lochs with typically some 500 metres between individuals, however Loch Ewe held 25 in 2009 and 45 in 2010. They were usually located close to the shoreline feeding particularly on crabs and crustaceans in the shallower, sheltered bays often close to human habitation, harbours, fish-farms, etc. When doing so, birds often afforded fairly close views on being located before eventually chugging away when approached too closely. They often dived and covered great distances under water to get away and were rarely seen to fly if feeding or

sheltering close inshore. Views of flying birds were very few and far between, e.g. an occasional sighting early morning from headlands as birds fly up the sea-loch into calmer waters. The areas covered by Team 1, being the west coast element of the survey area, held the greatest quantity of these divers as evidenced from the records below.

**Discussion.** Another behavioural pattern we have witnessed on Winter Duck is Great Northern Diver semi-submerging if alarmed or an over-head or water borne predator appears. The behavioural pattern seen is where the bird lowers its head and full body length down into the water, the head and neck often seen elongated and lowered in a pose, that appears to make them smaller or hidden from the danger. In summer birds naturally lower themselves in the water to allow young to ride on their backs, but this behaviour appears different and only undertaken when alarmed. When the danger can be escaped from the birds paddle away rapidly.

One of our group has witnessed similar behaviour with Grebe species, in particular Pied-billed Grebe, Podilymbus podiceps, but this particular species submerged totally apart from its head. (*Christophers .S., 2001.*)

#### Conclusions.

The records of three diver species seen on survey in NW/N Scotland by RAFOS as part of the WeBS survey in winter are proving very valuable in support of The WeBS National Survey, as well as providing much needed kudos for the Society. Furthermore, input from 10km squares during the winter months has also provided data that has been assessed as part of Bird Atlas 2007-11 The Breeding and Wintering Birds of Britain and Ireland (Balmer, D.E., et al BTO Books, Thetford), where for example winter records of Red-throated Diver have undergone a 32% expansion range since the 1981-84 Winter Atlas, with a large part of the expansion being off NW Scotland and Ireland. Some of the increase may be due to better coverage but some gains are likely to be real.

The Bird Atlas 2007-11, also contains new data on Black-throated Diver. The winter distribution of Black-throated Diver also has a strong westerly emphasis per the winter distribution map, with hotspots in Cornwall and Northwest Scotland; it is surprising that the species is so scarce around the Irish coastline and Irish Sea. There has been a 51% range expansion since the 1981-84 Winter Atlas but some gains are undoubtedly due to improved coverage, for example in Northwest Scotland.

Fluctuation of survey maximum counts should be considered. These totals are interesting and could mainly be due to adverse weather well north of the survey area and birds moving south to more hospitable waters. Potential consideration to the possibility that we see birds that regularly return to the NW of Scotland yearly and regularly return to their normal favoured haunts and in severe winters are supplemented by additional birds who are pushed south by weather. The sheltered sea lochs and large open water areas are most certainly to their liking.
